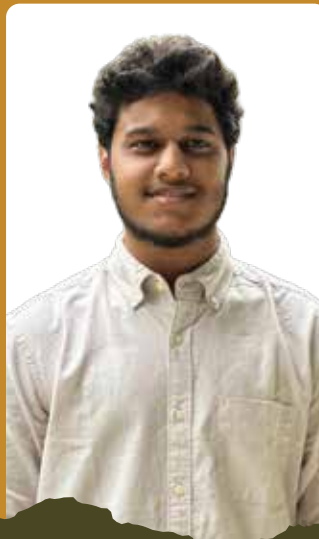

Directorate of Student Discipline and Hostels



The Directorate of Student Discipline & Hostels is a vital administrative unit of the University, responsible for ensuring a safe, secure, disciplined, and conducive residential and campus environment that supports students' academic, personal, and professional development. The Directorate serves as the primary coordinating body for student conduct, hostel administration, student welfare, residential life management, and enforcement of university regulations.

The Directorate is entrusted with the administration and supervision of all student hostels, including room allotment, residential services, mess management, maintenance coordination, safety and security measures, grievance redressal, and student engagement activities. It works closely with Faculty Wardens, Resident Wardens, Hostel Staff, Security Personnel, and various University departments to ensure efficient hostel operations and a positive residential experience for students.

In the area of student discipline, the Directorate is responsible for promoting a culture of responsibility, mutual respect, integrity, and adherence to the University's Code of Conduct. It oversees the implementation of disciplinary policies, investigates cases of indiscipline and misconduct, recommends corrective and disciplinary measures, and facilitates counselling and rehabilitation wherever appropriate. The Directorate also plays a proactive role in preventing ragging, substance abuse, violence, harassment, and other activities that may adversely affect campus harmony and student well-being. Detailed policies on these are attached in the student handbook.

Student Code of Conduct

The student code of conduct is a fundamental framework that outlines the expectations and responsibilities of the students within the academic community. It is designed to foster a respectful, inclusive, and safe environment conducive to learning and personal growth. This code encompasses various principles, including academic integrity, respect for diversity, appropriate behaviour, attendance requirements, and the responsible use of university resources.

General Guidelines

- i. Every student duly enrolled at SRM University-AP shall, at all times, remain subject to the disciplinary control and jurisdiction of the University and its respective Schools, Departments, and constituent units.
- ii. Every student at the University shall be subject to and shall strictly adhere to the disciplinary framework of the University and comply with all rules, regulations, and disciplinary policies in force within and outside the university premises.
- iii. All rules and regulations of SRM University-AP shall be applicable to students in both online and offline modes, and violations in either mode shall attract disciplinary action.
- iv. Any act of non-compliance with the rules and regulations of the University shall render the student liable to disciplinary action in accordance with the applicable policies by the competent authorities.
- v. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to execute a declaration affirming that, upon admission, he or she voluntarily submits to the disciplinary jurisdiction Of the Vice-Chancellor and such Other authorities of the University, Schools, or Departments as may be vested with disciplinary powers under the applicable Acts, Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations, rules, and guidelines framed by the University from time to time.
- vi. All Schools and Departments of the University shall be duty-bound to implement and comply with all instructions and directions issued under these Regulations and shall extend full cooperation and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to ensure their effective enforcement.
- vii. The Heads of Schools and Departments, Deans of Faculties, Directors and Librarians shall exercise such authority over students within their respective Schools, Departments, or institutions as may be necessary for the orderly administration and proper conduct thereof. Such authorities may exercise their powers directly or delegate the same to designated faculty members, subject to the approval of the Vice- Chancellor.
- viii. The University campus is declared a Smoke-Free, Alcohol-Free, and Drug- Free Zone. In accordance with the laws of the State Of Andhra Pradesh and other applicable laws, the possession, consumption, or use of intoxicants, drugs, alcohol, or prohibited substances is unlawful and strictly prohibited within and outside the university premises and premises operated by the university. SRM University-AP follows a policy of zero tolerance toward such substances or materials.
 - a. The use, possession, consumption, distribution, sale, or peddling of tobacco products, alcohol, illegal drugs, smoking materials, "Illicit Substances" or "Illicit Drugs or any controlled or prohibited substances, as well as being under the influence of such substances within the University campus or hostel premises or premises operated by the university, is strictly prohibited.
 - b. Tobacco products in any form are strictly prohibited within the University campus.
 - c. If any prohibited substance or material as specified above is found in a hostel room or in the possession of a student anywhere within the campus or premises operated by the University, strict disciplinary action shall be initiated against the concerned student(s) or room occupant(s), in accordance with the University's disciplinary policy, where involvement in consumption, possession, or peddling is established.

- d. Right of Inspection & Search. Security personnel, Vigilance officer and wardens or any person duly appointed by the university are authorized to conduct frisking, inspection of baggage, and breath analysis using appropriate devices where there is reasonable suspicion of alcohol consumption or possession of prohibited substances, in accordance with law.
 - e. Notwithstanding the foregoing, possession and use of medicines prescribed by a registered medical practitioner for legitimate medical treatment shall be permitted. A copy of such prescription given by a registered medical practitioner shall be maintained by the student and will be subjected for verification/ cross- verification, if necessary. Such evidence or prescription may be used by the University to take any disciplinary action against the student in accordance with the University's disciplinary policy.
 - f. In cases involving substance abuse, including narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances, controlled substances, or any substance declared controlled under applicable law, the University Disciplinary Committee shall be empowered to impose expulsion at the first instance, subject to due process.
 - g. Permitting or facilitating the entry of day boarders into hostel rooms with the intent of using, consuming, or distributing illicit substances or prohibited materials, with or without the consent of the hostel occupant, shall be treated as peddling. Severe disciplinary action shall be initiated against both the day boarder(s) and the hostel resident(s) concerned.
 - h. The University authorities reserve the right to inform the parents or guardians of students found to have violated any of the above provisions.
 - i. Where required under applicable law, or in cases involving serious violations, the University may refer the matter to appropriate law enforcement authorities. The decision of the University Management in such cases shall be final and binding, subject to applicable law.
- ix. Any form Of sexual misconduct, harassment, Or related misconduct shall be treated as a serious offense and dealt with in accordance with the University's Policy on Sexual Harassment and applicable law.
 - x. No individual or organization shall use the name, logo, seal, restricted images, trademarks, or other identifiers of SRM University—AP, or any mark suggesting association with the University or any of its Schools, Departments, or Centers, without prior written authorization from the competent University authority or as otherwise permitted under applicable trademark laws.
 - xi. The use of the official seal of the University on publications, manufactured articles, or any other material is strictly prohibited unless expressly authorized in writing by the University. Applications for such authorization shall be submitted to the Registrar of the University.
 - xii. Students shall conduct themselves in a manner befitting the academic environment of the University and shall maintain decorum in classrooms, libraries, and all other campus facilities. While no formal dress code is prescribed, students shall maintain attire and appearance consistent with the dignity and ethos of an educational institution.
 - xiii. The use of mobile phones is prohibited in classrooms and libraries except with the prior permission of the faculty member or authority concerned. Sleeping in classrooms and libraries is also prohibited.
 - xiv. Students shall exercise due care and responsibility in the use of university facilities and resources and shall refrain from any act resulting in wastage, misuse, or damage.
 - xv. Any act of vandalism, damage, or destruction of university property, including furniture, fixtures, equipment, or buildings, shall render the student(s) responsible liable to disciplinary action and to compensate the University for the loss or damage caused.
 - xvi. Consumption or carrying of food items is prohibited in classrooms, libraries, auditoriums, laboratories, or any other venue where academic or official activities are being conducted.

Do's and Don'ts

- Any form of groupism, including fighting or unlawful conduct that disrupts campus harmony, is strictly prohibited.
- Students are encouraged to utilize their free time constructively in academic facilities such as libraries and laboratories, extra co-curricular activities and sports.
- Disorderly movement in verandas, congregations in front of offices, obstruction of campus roads, or sitting in unsafe or prohibited areas such as parapets, staircases, and footpaths is prohibited.
- The SRM University—AP campus shall be maintained as a smoke-free, alcohol-free, and drug-free environment. Possession, use, or consumption Of tobacco, alcohol, or any intoxicating substances within the campus Or hostels is strictly prohibited.
- Silence and decorum shall be maintained in libraries, classrooms, examination halls, laboratories, dining halls, and other public areas.
- Use of mobile phones in classrooms, libraries, and laboratories is prohibited unless expressly permitted by the competent authority. The possession and use of mobile phones and other electronic communication devices in examination halls is strictly forbidden.
- Students shall refrain from participating in any undesirable activity and shall always maintain the highest standards of discipline
- Students shall not engage in anti-institutional, anti-national, antisocial, communal, immoral, or political expressions or activities within and outside the university campus or hostels.
- No student shall exert undue influence or coercion over fellow students.
- Politically affiliated students, organizations, or outfits are not permitted on campus. Students shall not organize, participate in, or attend activities sponsored by political organizations, including wearing politically symbolic attire or displaying slogans, accessories, or speeches.
- Students shall not deface, damage, destroy, or cause loss to any public, private, or University property, including but not limited to gym facilities, dining halls, classrooms, hostels, toilets, lifts, music rooms, sports equipment, and laboratory equipment. Students should properly switch off the AC, Fan, Lights, TV's and other equipment when not in use.
- Unauthorized entry Of outsiders into the campus or hostels is prohibited. Students shall not bring outsiders into university premises without prior permission from the competent authority.
- Distribution, circulation, or display of unauthorized notices, pamphlets, leaflets, or obscene material by any means within the campus or hostels is prohibited.
- Display of banners, flags, boards, or similar materials within campus premises, buildings, gates, or compound walls is prohibited without authorisation.
- Collection of money by solicitation or coercion within the campus or hostels is prohibited.
- Any form of strike, procession, agitation, protest, gherao, blockade, or violent disturbance within or outside the University premises is prohibited.
- Gherao, unlawful confinement, or detention of any University official is strictly prohibited.
- Possession or use of weapons, explosives, or any object capable of causing injury or damage to life or property is prohibited.
- Rash, negligent, or reckless driving within university premises is prohibited. Use Of personal vehicles without valid documents or protective gear, including triple riding On two-wheelers, is strictly prohibited.

- Students charged with criminal offenses or under suspension or expulsion shall not enter University premises without prior written permission of the competent authority.
- Any criminal activity or breach of law and order within university premises shall be reported to the police authorities.
- Waste shall be disposed of only in designated bins provided across the campus, including classrooms, hostels, offices, canteens, and mess halls.
- Any conduct that brings disrepute or lowers the esteem of the University is prohibited and will result in strict disciplinary action.
- Students shall respect the rights and dignity of others in expressing opinions.
- Students shall refrain from inciting or provoking fellow students, colleagues, or the University administration.
- No Student should be involved in any illegal, immoral activity of any kind with or without using the Student ID issued by the university. If found suitable disciplinary actions will be taken against such students.
- If a student is found guilty or with any pending criminal proceedings against him/her in any courts or police station across India and outside India, then the university reserves the right to take appropriate action against students at any point of time including expulsion.
- Be informed that any indiscipline or misconduct will be recorded in the student ERP to trace history by the Directorate of Student Discipline and Hostels.
- Respect the wellness, privacy and safety of others and abstain from unwanted behavior thereby not supporting, participating and committing any violation of this Code.
- Co-Operate and provide information at a disciplinary hearing
- Acknowledge that the decision of SRMAP is final and binding.
- Understand and acknowledge that sanctions as deemed essential will be imposed on violating any of the disciplinary policies.
- It is mandated to complete the sanctions (punishments) imposed by the university.
- Students should avoid disgraceful public display of affection (indecent position/ objectionable pose, etc) or any other inappropriate behavior with a fellow student or an outsider or a staff member, within or outside the university premises or premises maintained by the university. If found guilty, appropriate action will be taken by the university's disciplinary committee.
- Students should maintain all their personal belongings, especially jewellery, and gadgets such as personal laptops, cell phones, money, and other expensive materials with utmost care and caution. Management will not be held responsible in case of any theft or loss or damage to such items.
- Entering or accessing female hostels by male students is strictly prohibited and vice versa.
- Parents are not allowed to enter the classroom, lab area, hostel rooms unless it is specifically allowed by the staff/ warden or competent authority. Parents should meet the students in the appropriate common waiting area.
- Non-compliance with any of the above provisions shall attract strict disciplinary action

Ragging

Ragging, in any form, being illegal as declared by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and prohibited under applicable law, is strictly forbidden within the premises of the University, including its hostels, Schools, Departments, constituent units, Centers, University transport systems, and any other area forming part of the SRM University- AP system. Any individual or collective act, conduct, or practice amounting to ragging shall constitute gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with strictly under these Regulations and applicable law. Acts or practices constituting ragging shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following:

- Conduct that subjects' students to ridicule, contempt, humiliation, or adversely affects their self-esteem;
- Verbal abuse, aggression, indecent gestures, or obscene behavior; Physical assault or threat of use of physical force against any student;
- Abetment of ragging, whether by direct/ indirect participation, instigation, encouragement, facilitation, or any Other form Of support, which shall be deemed to constitute ragging;
- Any violation of this provision shall attract severe disciplinary action, including rustication or expulsion from the University, in addition to action under criminal law.

Anti-Ragging UGC Guidelines 

PROCEDURE FOR HANDLING CASES OF INDISCIPLINE OF STUDENTS

- The Head of a School, Department, Constituent Unit, or Centre, the authorities of the University hostels, and the security staff shall take immediate action upon receiving information regarding any incident of ragging, indiscipline, misbehavior, or misconduct and shall promptly inform the Director Student Discipline & Hostel and the Chief Security Officer.
- Notwithstanding the above, the Director, Student Discipline & Hostels, may also, Suo motu, initiate a preliminary inquiry into any incident involving ragging, indiscipline, misconduct, or misbehavior and submit a report to the Registrar or the Vice-Chancellor, identifying the persons prima facie involved and setting out the facts and circumstances of the incident. Pending completion of the inquiry and without prejudice to the rights of the persons concerned, appropriate interim or preliminary disciplinary measures may be taken, as deemed necessary, in accordance with the applicable University rules and regulations.
- The Director Student Discipline & Hostel may, where deemed necessary, communicate with the parents or guardians of the students concerned in matters requiring their assistance or intervention.
- Upon completion of the preliminary investigation, the Director Student Discipline & Hostel shall submit an initial report to the Student Discipline Committee/ Registrar or Vice- Chancellor establishing, prima facie, the identity of the perpetrators and detailing the nature of the ragging, gross indiscipline, misbehavior, or misconduct.
- Where the Head of the School, Department, Institution, Constituent Unit, Centre, or the Director Student Discipline & Hostel is satisfied, for reasons to be recorded in writing, that it is not reasonably practicable to conduct a formal inquiry, appropriate recommendations may be made to the Registrar accordingly.
- The Director Student Discipline & Hostel shall assist the Registrar/ Vice- Chancellor in the exercise Of disciplinary authority in respect of students at the University and its Schools, Departments, Corustituent Units, and Centers.
- The Director Student Discipline & Hostel shall exercise such powers and perform such functions relating to student discipline as may be assigned by the Vice-Chancellor from time to time.
- Where the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold a formal inquiry, his decision shall be final and binding as an appellate authority. In other cases, he may refer/ revert the matter to the Student Disciplinary Committee constituted by him from time to time.

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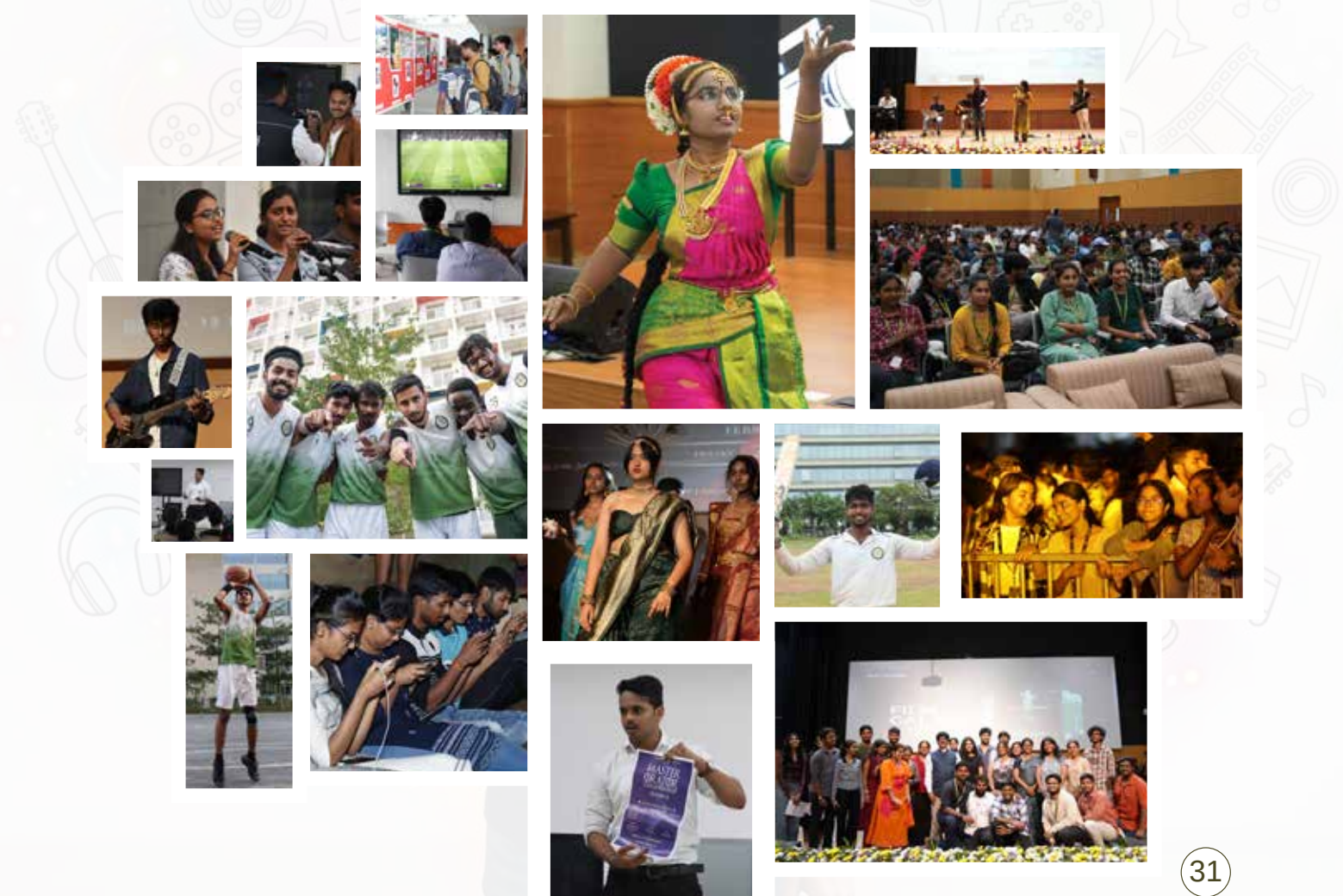

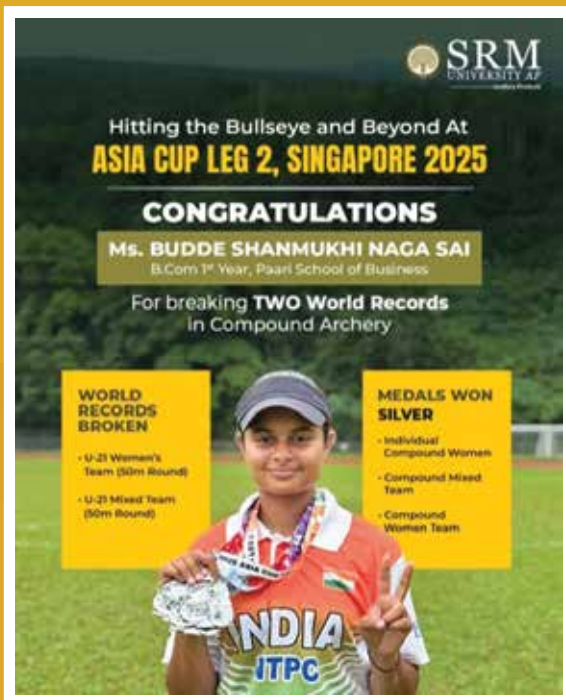
Sports

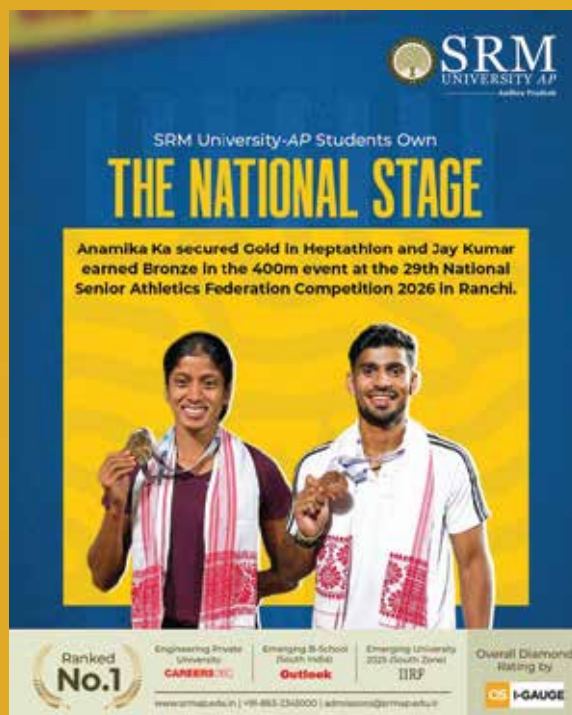

Corporate Relations and Career Services (CR&CS)

The Directorate of Corporate Relations and Career Services (CR&CS) at SRM University-AP is committed to empowering students to step confidently into the professional world, equipped with the knowledge, skills, and mindset required to thrive in a competitive global market. The Directorate serves as the primary link between academia and industry, fostering robust collaborations with leading organisations to ensure students graduate with both theoretical expertise and practical, real-world experience. Led by Dr M S Vivekanandan, Director of CR&CS, the Directorate has partnered with over 1,300 companies, maintains a placement rate of 95 per cent, and has recorded a highest package of 55 LPA for its graduating students.

The Directorate's work is structured around several flagship programmes:

Training – Equips students with essential soft skills and professional competencies, including leadership, communication, and critical thinking, through domain-specific workshops, aptitude and communication training, and industry interaction designed to align learning outcomes with industry requirements.

Internships – Provides students with hands-on industrial exposure through structured summer internships of six to eight weeks for second-year BTech, BSc, and BBA students, and first-year MTech and MBA students, embedded within the curriculum and carrying academic credit across the School of Engineering and Sciences, the School of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences, and the Paari School of Business.

Placement – Follows a structured, four-phase recruitment process comprising Job Posting and Application, Pre-Placement Talks, a multi-stage Job Selection Process encompassing written assessments, technical interviews, and HR rounds, and Final Selection and Offer generation, ensuring the best match between students and prospective employers.

Destination Japan – A flagship initiative built on decades of experience training engineers for the Japanese market, preparing students from Computer Science Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering, Electrical and Electronics Engineering, and Mechanical Engineering in Japanese language, culture, and work ethos through a dedicated Industry Readiness Centre. Since May 2024, over 125 graduates have secured positions with Japanese companies across cities including Tokyo, Shiga, Kochi, and Toyama, with 90 students from the 2026 batch and a further 100 students from the 2027 batch currently undergoing training. The programme was recently strengthened through a Memorandum of Understanding with Technosmile, a Japan-based global hiring and human resources firm, to establish a dedicated international student internship pathway.

Beyond recruitment, the Directorate offers personalised career guidance, professional development workshops, mentorship opportunities, and access to an alumni network, supporting students throughout their professional journey. Through sustained engagement with corporate partners in India and abroad, the Directorate strives to bridge the gap between academic learning and industry expectations, ensuring that graduates emerge with the composure, confidence, and competence required for successful careers ahead

Directorate of Entrepreneurship and Innovation (DoEI)

The Directorate of Entrepreneurship and Innovation (DoEI) at SRM University–AP serves as a pivotal platform fostering collaboration among the three key pillars of a progressive society: Government, Industry, and Academia. Through this strategic synergy, the Directorate aims to cultivate a robust innovation and entrepreneurial ecosystem that empowers students to become self-reliant leaders and contributors to national development, in alignment with the vision of Atmanirbhar Bharat. Its primary objective is to develop leadership, innovation, and entrepreneurial competencies among students, enabling them to transform ideas into viable solutions and enterprises. The Directorate is recognised by the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) and the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), and works alongside ecosystem partners including Chakra Dialogue and Impact Hub.

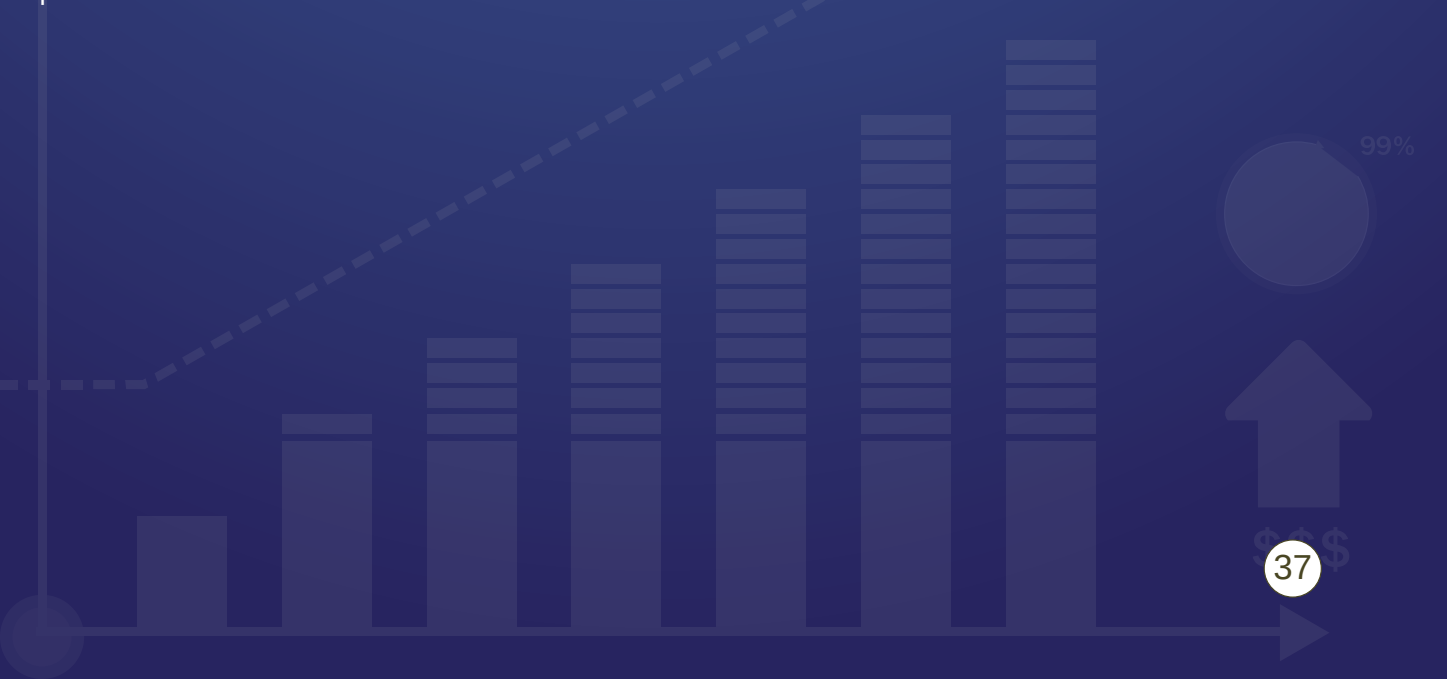
The Directorate's work is anchored around three flagship wings:

Hatchlab Research Centre (HRC) – The University's Technology Business Incubator, supporting ventures through a Pre-Incubation Programme, an Incubation Programme, and dedicated Schemes and Funding, including its selection as an Implementation Agency for MeitY's GENESIS scheme. HRC operates from a 10,000+ square foot facility, incubates over 30 student-led startups, and provides seed funding of up to ₹5 lakh alongside mentorship from industry mentors and investors.

Centre for Entrepreneurial Learning (CEL) – Cultivates an entrepreneurial mindset among students, faculty, and staff through courses such as Entrepreneurial Mindset I and II, minor and major specialisations, open electives, and certificate and diploma programmes. CEL is led by Prof. Sidharth Tripathy, Director of Entrepreneurship and Innovation, and Shri Udayan Bakshi, Associate Director.

Entrepreneurship Cell (E-Cell) – A student-driven initiative connecting aspiring entrepreneurs with startups and industry experts through events including Elevator Pitch, the Global Venture Summit, Trigger Point, and Investor Hunt, alongside hackathons, founder talks, and startup showcases.

Beyond these flagship wings, the Directorate organises workshops, bootcamps, and competitions that encourage experiential learning and problem solving, and connects students with mentors, investors, and ecosystem partners to expand their networks and opportunities. It also extends its impact beyond the campus through collaborations with external institutions, entrepreneurship cells, and community organisations, reinforcing the belief that sustainable development is achieved through collaboration rather than isolation. Through this integrated approach, the Directorate equips students with the skills, exposure, and support required to translate their ideas into sustainable ventures, complementing their academic learning with practical entrepreneurial experience.



Directorate of International Relations and Higher Studies (IRHS)

The Directorate of International Relations and Higher Studies (IRHS) is a vital administrative unit of the University, dedicated to fostering a globally connected academic environment and preparing students to engage confidently with international opportunities in education, research, and career development. The Directorate serves as the University's primary gateway to the world, building and sustaining partnerships with leading universities, institutions, and organisations across the globe to ensure students benefit from a truly international academic experience.

The Directorate's work is anchored around the following flagship programmes including the **Student Mobility and Exchange Programme, Global Immersion Programme, and Semester Abroad Programme**, which enable students to study at partner universities abroad for varying durations, from short-term structured academic and cultural engagement to a full semester overseas, allowing them to earn credits while gaining fresh academic and cultural perspectives. The International Transfer Programme facilitates seamless academic transitions for students wishing to continue their studies at a partner institution overseas, while the Progression Pathway Programme supports students in advancing to postgraduate studies at reputed international universities through established academic collaborations. The International Internship places students with overseas organisations to gain valuable industry experience in a global setting, and the Inbound Mobility Programme welcomes international students to the University, enriching the campus community through cross-cultural interaction and shared learning.

Beyond the flagship offerings, the Directorate provides ongoing guidance to students on international opportunities, supports faculty and student exchange agreements, and works closely with academic departments to align global initiatives with institutional priorities. Through sustained collaboration with partner universities and organisations worldwide, the Directorate ensures that students graduate not only with strong academic credentials but also with the global outlook, cultural competence, and international exposure necessary to succeed in an increasingly interconnected world.
